Section B will consists of 6 Short Answer Type Questions 5 from each of the 2 units covered out of which the candidate will be required to answer any five. Each question will be of two marks ( $2 \times 5 = 10$ ).

External End Semester University Exam: 80 marks

The question paper will consist of three sections A, B & C.

Section -A will consists of 4 Long Answer Type questions 2 each from the 2 units covered in the internal test. Out of which the candidate will be required to answer questions of 1 question from each unit. Each question will be of 20 marks ( $20 \times 2 = 40$ ).
